Koscielski and Nu chapter for receiving a grant from the Lambda State Foundation

for the program Make the Arts your Superpower through Storytelling! Roberta and Sarah Couri, head librarian at the McClure Branch library, wrote the grant application for the \$9,110 project. The Lambda State grant is for \$2000, the Peoria Public Library will donate \$1,000 for the use of their facilities: and Nu chapter will contribute the remaining \$6,110. Gadzooks! How will Nu chip in \$6,110? Shazam! You may have forgotten how valuable you are. We will add the \$6,110 through our hours of volunteering with the project. Congratulations to Nu Chapter and Sarah Couri, Manager of Peoria Public Library McClure Branch. The Lambda State Foundation for Educational Studies, Inc. is awarding Nu Chapter \$2,000 for the project, "Make the Arts Your Superpower Through Storytelling." Nu Chapter will soon receive a congratulatory letter along with a check. This grant proposal was written by Sarah Couri as a follow-up project to "Make the Arts Your Superpower" which was funded by the Lambda State Foundation for Educational Studies in 2021. "Make the Arts Your Superpower Through Storytelling" will include a variety of volunteer opportunities for Nu Chapter members in early 2023.

Student Literary Writing Contest

The DKG IL Literacy Committee is excited to highlight Student Literary Arts Recognition Program entries during the 2023 DKG IL annual convention. Three themes have been selected according to grade levels as follows:

Grades 1-4 KINDNESS (1 page handwritten)

Starter suggestions for writing about KINDNESS include

• Tell about a time that someone showed kindness to you. How did that feel?

• Tell about ways you can show kindness to your family or a friend.

• Tell about people who have taught you about kindness. Why was that important?

Grades 5-8 BULLYING (2 pages handwritten or 1 page typed and double spaced)

Starter suggestions for writing about BULLYING include

• Tell about a time when you or a friend were bullied. How did that feel?

• Tell about a time you bullied someone. What might you have done instead?

• Tell about online bullying. What is a good way to handle online bullying?

Grades 9-12 GUN SAFETY (2 pages typed and double spaced)

Starter suggestions for writing about GUN SAFETY include

• What is the difference between what our founding fathers were probably thinking about having guns and owning guns today?

• What do you think about the sale of AR 15 weaponry? What kinds of laws do you think are necessary to ensure public safety? What would you say in a letter to your congressman?

• How do recent school and/or other public shootings make you feel? What thoughts do you have each day as you go to school? What safety steps should be taken to make students feel safer?

Please consider encouraging young people you know to submit an entry into this contest. Entries are due on February 15, 2023. Information on how and where to submit entries will be forthcoming.

Nu Chapter members will soon receive this form along with a cover sheet with instructions. These items will be made available to local educators and Nu Chapter members are encouraged to make them available to educators as well.

Scholarship/Study Stipend

DKG Illinois State Organization Scholarship/Special Study Stipend application deadlines are January 9, 2023.

If you will have completed a workshop, seminar, or class for your professional or personal growth between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022, you may apply for an ILSO Special Study Stipend.

Contact Cathy Curtis or Roberta Koscielski for ILSO Special Study Stipend guidelines and application form. \$500 has been approved for stipend awards.

Are you planning to enroll for:

- an academic year of full-time foreign or domestic study (\$2000 scholarship)
- a minimum of 12 semester hour or the equivalent of foreign or domestic
- study (\$1000 scholarship)
- a minimum of 6 semester hours for undergraduate or graduate work (\$500 scholarship)

Coursework is to be taken after April 2023 and completed within 2 years of that date.

The M. Josephine O'Neil Arts Award (up to \$10,000) guidelines and application can be found on ILSO website under Committees, Women in the Arts. Letter of Intent deadline January 1, 2023; application deadline February 1, 2023. Applicant must be:

- A legal resident of Illinois

- In or approaching her junior year at an accredited college/ university, MAJORING in one or more of the arts – music, dance, theater, visual arts
- Recommended by a local Illinois State Chapter
