**Call to Order** First Vice-President Carol Sleeth called the meeting to order at 4:38 p.m. at Proctor Place followed by the recitation of *A Collect for Teachers*. A quorum was present with 13 members in attendance.

**Educational Excellence** (Connie Voss) Mary Jane Sterling will present "Math in the Movies" at the May 6<sup>th</sup> meeting at PPL North Branch. The June 3<sup>rd</sup> program will be Peoria History Bus Tour II led by Cathy Curtis and Tom Menger.

**Communications and Marketing** Cam Ratcliff shared highlights from Peoria Women's Federation speaker Molly Hogeboom, Easterseals Central IL Community Engagement Manager, who spoke about the many services offered by Easterseals. *Nu's Notes* deadline is April 22<sup>nd</sup>. #### Professional Advancement and Outreach

(Roberta Koscielski) Roberta Koscielski reported that Notre Dame High School has applied for the Nu Chapter Grant. The application deadline is March 31<sup>st</sup>. Artist in Residence Destinee Wilson held a writing workshop February 18<sup>th</sup> and a writing class February 23rd at PPL McClure Branch with additional classes scheduled for March 18<sup>th</sup>/23<sup>rd</sup>. Sessions for students at Knoxville Center for Student Success are February 22<sup>nd</sup>/28<sup>th</sup> and March 7<sup>th</sup>/14<sup>th</sup>/21<sup>st</sup>. Peoria Regional Learning Center sessions have yet to be scheduled. Students receive a personal journal for writing, a copy of Respect the Mic. a pencil, and a pen. Shirley Dresden shared her partially constructed puzzle used to chart MMM Well Project donations and encouraged members to purchase baked goods, the proceeds from which will help meet the \$450.00 Well Project goal. Should the goal be reached, an anonymous donor will match the amount, thus allowing Nu Chapter to purchase two wells.

**Adjournment** The meeting adjourned at 5:08 p.m.



# Apply for your share of the Facebook Settlement

from the Peoria Journal Star, April 2023

"If you have had a Facebook account between 2007 and 2022, you could have some free money coming to you."

"Anyone in the U.S. who had a Facebook account from May 24, 2007, and December 22, 2022, can file a claim."

"To file online, go to

facebookuserprivacysettlement.com, click on the "submit claim" tab, fill out the form and then decide how you would like to be paid: prepaid Mastercard gift cards, PayPal, Venmo, direct deposit or Zelle."

"To file by mail, you can print out the claim forms at facebookuserprivacysettlement.com, click on the important documents tab, and mail in the forms."

## All clams must be filed by August 25, 2023.

The average payout to each claim has yet to be determined. The larger the number of people submitting valid claims, the smaller each payment will be since the money has to be divided among the claims."

The final settlement hearing is scheduled for September 7, 2023, so payments won't be distributed until after that."
