The goal is to learn about what was fought for over the years and provide incentive for continued advocacy. The students saw what a powerful woman Harriet was and how she changed the lives of so many others. They have been using a book series and other resources and wanted to finish the project by attending the movie Harriet. And that's where our grant money came in.

The teachers and students had raised over $\$ 200$ but needed a total of $\$ 481$ for the theater tickets. Our contribution made their capstone adventure possible.

## Recipes

Several people asked about a recipe for the sausage squares at November's meeting. It's pretty much "to taste," but here's how to start.

## Cheezy Sausage Squares

- 1 pound good quality Italian sausage
- $1 / 2$ to 1 pound cheese (cheddar, Swiss, Monterey jack, mixture) - to taste
- 2 to 6 tablespoons ketchup - to taste
- Garlic powder - to taste
- Worcestershire sauce - to taste
- Loaf of cocktail/party rye or pumpernickel

Brown sausage and chop into small pieces. There shouldn't be any fat to drain off, but do drain if there is.
Cut up or shred the cheese. Add slowly to the sausage, letting it melt. Add enough to make a spreadable mixture.
Add the ketchup (or skip it, if you prefer).
Add garlic powder and Worcestershire to taste.
Spread the mixture on the party rye squares.
Place the squares on a cookie sheet.
Place under the broiler until the mixture bubbles. Watch it carefully. It doesn't take long.

And, for those of you wanting a more "healthy" snack, here are two recipes from 50 Plus News \& Views. (Thank you, Cam.)

## Banana Pecan Cherry Oatmeal

(Makes two bowls)

- 1 cup old-fashioned oats
- 2 cups water
- $1 / 2$ cup pecan milk
- 1 banana, sliced
- $1 / 4$ cup pecan halves
- $1 / 4$ cup dried tart cherries
- $1 / 4$ cup honey

In large, microwave-safe bowl, combine oats and water. Microwave on high 3-4 minutes, or until oats are cooked through. Watch carefully to avoid boiling over.
Remove from microwave, stir and divide between two bowls. Pour $1 / 4$ cup pecan mild over each bowl. Divide sliced banana, pecan halves, and dried tart cherries between each bold and drizzle with honey. Serve immediately.

## Cherry Pecan Energy Bites

(Makes 10-12 bites)

- 1 cup toasted pecan halves or pieces
- 1 cup dried cherries
- 4 medjool dates, pitted
- $1 / 4$ cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 T. cacao powder, plus additional for coating (optional)
- 1 t . vanilla extract

In bowl of food processor, combine all ingredients. Pulse until ingredients begin to bind and form a loose, dough-like ball.
Roll into 1 -inch balls. Roll balls in additional cacao powder, if desired, and transfer to airtight container. Refrigerate until ready to serve, up to seven days
