Something Worth Doing

By Jane Kirkpatrick

In 1853, Abigail Scott was a 19-year-old school teacher in Oregon Territory when she married Ben Duniway. Marriage meant giving up on teaching, but Abigail always believed she was meant to be more than a good wife and mother. When financial mistakes and an injury force Ben to stop working, Abigail becomes the primary breadwinner for her growing family. What she sees as a working woman appalls her, and she devotes her life to fighting for the rights of women, including their right to vote.

Following Abigail as she bears six children, runs a millinery and a private school, helps on the farm, writes novels, gives speeches, and eventually runs a newspaper supporting women's suffrage, Something Worth Doing explores issues that will resonate strongly with modern women: the pull between career and family, finding one's place in the public sphere, and dealing with frustrations and prejudices

women encounter when they compete in maledominated spaces. Based on a true story of a pioneer for women's rights from award-winning author Jane Kirkpatrick will inspire you to believe that some things are worth doing--even when the cost is great.

#### Dinner at Family House




On Saturday, March 7, five Nu Chapter members prepared dinner for the 30–40 people currently staying at Family House.

Since 1982, Family House has been providing affordable lodging and meals for families with patients in one of the three Peoria hospitals. Some stays are overnight. Others have stayed for months. People have come from 32 States and many Countries. The "suggested" fee for their stay is rather small; and the facilities offer so much to make their stay comfortable and manageable.

The meal prepared by Nu Chapter consisted of: five casseroles (one meatless), four dozen muffins (varying flavors), four huge pans of brownies (varying toppings), salad, carrots and cherry tomatoes. Three liters of soda were also brought, and chicken nuggets were available to any children in residence.

The food had to be prepared there, at Family House – nothing brought in from members' homes. The dinner was then served buffet-style as residents came back from the hospitals.





Nu Chapter members made donations in preparation of the event. Some packaged foods were provided, and monetary donations were made for the purchase of the needed supplies.

Due to the generosity of the Chapter members, Nu was able to purchase \$100 in food and supplies and give a monetary donation of \$60 to Family House.

One of the residents we spoke with was from Tempe, Arizona. She and her sister were taking turns staying with a brother who had been brought here from that State. Another resident had been there for several months, hoping that her husband could be released sometime in the near future.

The experience at Family House was exhilarating, humbling, satisfying, and just a bit exhausting. It was wonderful.
